For each quotation, (1) Identify <u>the title</u> or/and <u>the author</u> of this quotation (5 points); (2) Explain briefly the context of the quotation (10 point), and then (3) explain its significance (10 points). Altogether, this section will make up 50% of your final grade.

- 2. Explain the importance of slavery as a critical subject matter for one of the following writers: Harriet Beecher Stowe, Mark Twain, William Faulkner, Ralph Ellison, and Toni Morrison
- 3. Identify the main tenets of Modernism in the work of one of the following: T. S. Eliot, F. Scott Fitzgerald, Ernest Hemingway, and William Faulkner, William Carlos Williams, Langston Hughes, etc.
